- Send letters to FAFSA applicants with zero EFC
 - Temporary expansion of SNAP rules
 - Encourage students to apply via <u>GetCalFresh.org</u>
 - Letters serve as proof of temporary eligibility for CalFresh
- Send letters to recipients of a TANF-funded Cal Grant
 - Students receiving Cal Grant A or B tuition award qualify for exemption to Student Eligibility Rule
 - Pursuant to AB 214 (Chapter 134, Statutes of 2017)

Statewide CalFresh Call Center Proposal



- Become official CDSS outreach contractor draw down matching federal funds for outreach
- Hire limited-term staff (one-time funding) to expand Call Center and provide one-on-one assistance to college students
 - o Educate students about CalFresh benefits and the Student Eligibility Rule
 - o Assist students with completing the CalFresh application
 - o Assist students with mandatory verifications and preparing for interview
 - o Outreach directly to students that are likely eligible for CalFresh

Short-Term Strategies



- Data sharing between CSAC, institutions, and local human services agencies
 - CSAC and institutions have student information (i.e., Work Study, recipient of TANF-funded Cal Grant, participation in CTE programs, etc.) that eligibility workers need to verify exemptions
 - Student Verification Hub
- Utilize TANF funds for other financial aid programs
 - TANF recipients are exempt from the Student Eligibility Rule
 - Cal Grant Program partially funded by TANF but community college students cannot benefit
- Horizontal Integration with the FAFSA
 - Warm hand-off between FAFSA application and CalFresh application
- Improve the transition from Free/Reduced Price Meals to CalFresh

Long-Term Strategies



- Permanent exemption to the Student Eligibility Rule for Students with a 0 EFC
 - More students with documented need eligible for SNAP/CalFresh
- Elimination of the Student Eligibility Rule altogether
 - More students eligible for SNAP/CalFresh
 - Students are treated the same as other applicants
 - Less verification required
 - Reassess interview requirements
- Automatic/presumptive eligibility through existing financial aid systems
 - FAFSA already contains extensive information about student's financial circumstances – single application for financial aid and public benefits
