Reorganizations, Consolidations, and Elimination of Departments and Other Entities

• The Governor's May Revision proposes to reorganize, consolidate, and eliminate a number of Departments, Boards, and Commissions. Many of these proposals carry out policies first initiated in the California Performance Review conducted in Governor's Schwarzenegger's second year in office.

Most state functions are carried out by departments. These departments have directors appointed by and responsible to the Governor. Outside of these departments, the state also has hundreds of boards, commissions, and task forces which serve a variety of roles. Boards and commissions are generally more autonomous than departments. Board members and commissioners are appointed by a variety of individuals—including the Governor, legislative leaders, and constitutional officers. Members may be appointed for a fixed length of time (whereas department directors serve at the pleasure of the Governor).

• The May Revision roughly estimates \$50 million in General Fund savings, if the Legislature adopted all of the administration's proposals in this area. However, like most aspects of the May Revise, the administration has not provided a comprehensive fiscal evaluation of its proposal. In addition, this level of savings does not take into account any additional proposals that the Legislature may wish to pursue.

The administration has also proposed adoption of a new Control Section 13.25, to allow the Department of Finance to make necessary budget adjustments to reflect reorganizations and consolidations of departments or functions of departments that are approved by the Legislature.
