2025 is a pivotal year to save Hollywood and rebuild entertainment production. An unprecedented coalition of unions, studios, creators, and local business have joined forces to expand and strengthen the <u>Film & Television Tax Credit</u>.

- → 200,000 Californians work in the film, television, and streaming.
- → Without your urgent intervene Hollywood motion pictures threatens to become the next Pittsburgh steel or Detroit auto.

Even before the devastating LA fires, California suffered from record-high runaway productions for film, television, and streaming content.

- → In 2024 LA area shoots fell to the <u>lowest on record</u> outside of the 2020 pandemic.
- → Historically low production came in a year free of strikes and <u>before</u> the recent LA fires.
- → Productions are fleeing to lower cost jurisdictions with better incentives, taking middle class union jobs with them. Three in four projects rejected by CA program film out-of-state.

Gov Newsom's <u>budget proposal</u> would expand the Film & TV Tax Credit from the current <u>\$330M</u> to <u>\$750M</u> annually.

- → <u>73% of voters statewide</u> support Gov's proposal, per independent poll post Nov election.
- → Putting Angelenos back to work is mission critical to State's 'Marshall Plan' to help LA rebuild faster and stronger.
- → The program pays for itself. Average location film shoot <u>adds \$670,000 and 1,500 jobs per day</u> to local economy. Every tax credit dollar spent increases state's economic activity by \$24.40 and labor income by \$8.60.

More money alone will not make California fully competitive. <u>SB 630</u> and <u>AB 1138</u> by Senator Allen and Asm Zbur and Bryan will take on critical <u>programmatic reforms</u> enabling creators and local biz to take full advantage of the program.

We ask the Legislature to:

- → Raise the 20% base tax credit rate
- → Expand the types of productions that can be eligible for tax credits
- → Lift or eliminating the \$100M cap on qualified productions
- → Provide for season-over-season increases for TV series that produce stable employment for cast and crew
