	Approved placeholder trailer bill language that states Legislative intent and provides a definition of sustainable groundwater management:	
	SECTION 1. The Legislature finds and declares:  (a) The people of the state have a primary interest in the protection, management, and reasonable beneficial use of the water resources of the state, both surface and underground, and that the integrated management of the state's water resources is essential to meeting its water management goals;  (b) Groundwater provides a significant portion of California's water supply. Groundwater accounts for more than one-third of the water used by Californians in an average year and more than one-half in drought years, when other sources are unavailable;  (c) Excessive groundwater pumping can cause overdraft, failed wells, deteriorated water quality, environmental damage, and irreversible land subsidence that damages infrastructure and diminishes the capacity of aquifers to store water for the future;  (d) When properly managed, groundwater resources will help protect communities, farms and the environment against prolonged dry periods, and climate change, preserving water supplies for existing and potential beneficial use;  (e) Groundwater resources are most effectively managed at the local or regional level;  (f) Some local agencies manage their groundwater sustainably, either through local management structures or pursuant to an adjudication of water rights, while others have not done so, leading to a variety of serious local groundwater problems;  (g) Groundwater management will not be effective unless local actions to sustainably manage groundwater basins are taken;  (h) Local and regional agencies need to have the necessary support and authorities to manage groundwater sustainably; and  (i) In those circumstances where a local groundwater management agency is not managing its groundwater sustainably manage the groundwater management agency can sustainably manage the groundwater management agency can sustainably manage the groundwater management agency can sustainably manage the groundwater basin.	
	SEC. 2. Section 113 is added to the Water Code to read: It is the policy of the state that groundwater resources be managed sustainably. Sustainable groundwater management means the management of groundwater to provide for multiple long term benefits without resulting in or aggravating conditions that cause significant economic, social, or environmental impacts	

such as long-term overdraft, land subsidence, ecosystem degradation, depletions from surface water bodies, and water quality degradation, in order to protect the resource for future generations. Sustainable groundwater management requires the development, implementation and updating of local water budgets, plans and programs based on the best available science, monitoring, forecasting and use of technological resources.
