	LANGUAGE REQUIRING THE DEPARTMENT ON OR BEFORE JANUARY 10, 2012, TO PRESENT THE LEGISLATURE WITH A PLAN TO REDIRECT FISH AND GAME PRESERVATION FUND TO OTHER PRIORITIES WHILE BACKFILLING ANY RENEWABLE ENERGY ACTIVITIES WITH CAP AND TRADE FUNDING. 3-2 (JONES, VALADAO VOTED NO)	
ISSUE 3	<p>OCEAN DATA PROJECTS-STATEWIDE CONFORMITY  APPROVED the following trailer bill language:</p> <p>The Ocean Protection Council shall enter into a memorandum of understanding with and between the relevant departments, boards, commissions, and conservancies within the California Natural Resources Agency; the State Water Resources Control Board; and the California Technology Agency for the purposes of establishing a single web-based, publicly accessible portal for viewing, exchanging, and disseminating scientific and geospatial information about California's ocean and coast. The memorandum shall focus on coordinating the efforts of state agencies, but may provide for the participation of non-state entities including federal agencies, institutions of higher education, and non-governmental organizations with relevant expertise. The memorandum shall not adversely affect any California entity's authority to conduct independent data management activities or to develop data viewing or exchange tools for specialized applications or internal use.</p> <p>3-2 (JONES, VALADAO VOTED NO)</p>	33
ISSUE 4	<p>SUCTION DREDGING ISSUE: APPROVED MOTION BY HUFFMAN DIRECTING STAFF TO DEVELOP BUDGET TRAILER LANGUAGE THAT WOULD:</p> <p>1. REMOVE THE 2016 SUNSET IN ORDER TO PROVIDE TIME NEEDED TO IDENTIFY NEW REGULATIONS THAT MEET ENVIRONMENTAL STANDARDS AND REDUCE CONFUSION ABOUT STATUS OF THE PROGRAM. THIS WOULD HAVE THE EFFECT OF PUTTING IN PLACE A FUNCTIONAL MORATORIUM UNTIL NEW REGULATIONS ADDRESSING ENVIRONMENTAL IMPACTS, AND A NEW FEE SCHEDULE COVERING ALL REASONABLE COSTS, ARE DEVELOPED.</p> <p>2. ASK DFG TO CONSULT WITH OTHER AGENCIES, SUCH AS THE WATER BOARD, DEPARTMENT OF PUBLIC HEALTH AND THE NATIVE AMERICAN HERITAGE COMMISSION, AND REPORT BACK TO THE LEGISLATURE WITH RECOMMENDATIONS AS TO WHAT ADDITIONAL AUTHORITIES OR STATUTORY CHANGES WOULD BE NECESSARY TO DEVELOP SUCTION DREDGE REGULATIONS THAT WOULD MITIGATE ALL ENVIRONMENTAL IMPACTS, AND MAKE RECOMMENDATIONS FOR A FEE SCHEDULE THAT WOULD COVER ALL PROGRAM COSTS.</p> <p>3-2 (JONES, VALADAO VOTED NO)</p>

ISSUE 3	<p data-bbox="347 197 662 224">CAP-AND-TRADE UPDATE</p> <p data-bbox="396 228 1398 359">A) REJECTED 2012-13 BUDGET BILL CONTROL SECTION 15.11 WHICH WOULD ALLOW THE ADMINISTRATION TO EXPEND UP TO \$1 BILLION FROM CAP AND TRADE AUCTION ALLOWANCE PROCEEDS WITH NO FEWER THAN 30-DAY NOTIFICATION TO THE LEGISLATURE. 5-0</p> <p data-bbox="396 401 1398 594">B) APPROVED LANGUAGE IN CONCEPT: AUTHORIZE SPENDING OF CAP AND TRADE REVENUES FOR PURPOSES OF AB 32 GREENHOUSE GAS (GHG) EMISSIONS REDUCTION ACTIVITIES TO ACHIEVE AT LEAST \$500 MILLION IN GENERAL FUND SAVINGS; AND STIPULATE THAT ANY ADDITIONAL EXPENDITURE RELATED TO GHG EMISSIONS REDUCTIONS BE MADE PURSUANT TO FUTURE LEGISLATION. 3-2 (JONES, VALADAO VOTED NO)</p>	36
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
